Update from the Chair

As we approach the end of 2017, the Parish Council (PC) can reflect on a few events this year. The Village Hall as part of our maintenance programme has been redecorated and looks splendid, thanks to all involved. The Hall itself is an asset of the Community and used by many groups, there are still opportunities to hire it for a range of events, please contact the Clerk for details or view the website at https://www.essexinfo.net/runwell-parish-council. The kitchen is about to undergo a complete refit, we have applied to the Essex County Council, Community Initiatives Fund for a grant, the remainder will be funded from reserves.

In the Park, we have agreed with Chelmsford City Youth FC for them to use the football pitches for this season, and it provides revenue to help the PC to maintain the Park for everyone to use. The play equipment needs replacing, this is a major and expensive project. Whilst we are looking at various routes of funding, the PC are very frustrated that none of the £11.5 million proceeds from the St Luke's Park S106 agreement (a development levy), signed back in Nov 2013, were allocated to the only Public Open Space in the Village, namely Runwell Park. We are currently seeking more information and a possible solution from Chelmsford City Council. The intention is to have "state of the art" play equipment for all age groups and abilities.

Our Village is increasingly being used as a rat-run for commuter traffic at peak times and causes problems for Runwell School and public transport, not only in the Church End Lane/Brock Hill area but also Runwell Road. We have recently written 3 times to our County Councillor Ian Grundy, who is also Cabinet Member for Highways requesting a traffic survey, but are still awaiting a reply!! The PC will continue to pursue this, since we are concerned for the safety of the children and parents using the school. The replacement School Crossing Patrol Officer at Swan Lane is welcome in that respect. Finally, can I on behalf of everyone at Runwell Parish Council wish you all the very best for the Festive Season.

Runwell Village Hall the Centre of the Community



How things change! This is a picture of the Village Hall in approx 1935, which inspired me to investigate its history. I was able to identify it was originally owned by the Village Hall Company. However, it wasn't until January 1946 that a submission to the Ministry of Health and

Essex C.C was made to borrow £3,000 for the purpose of establishing a Village Club and Social Centre for the community. It took a further 9 years to purchase. (Information taken from an article by Mr Roy Dockerill, in the 1992 Roundabout) The Village Hall has certainly lived up to its purpose of bringing the community together. After

numerous refurbishments, we have an excellent venue for social events, community exhibitions, shows and celebrations.
